Pastor Greetings,

For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. Isaiah 9:6

The celebration of the birth of the Lord is more than a memory, an anniversary or a birthday. It is a current event, because every year we relive the coming of the Incarnate Word, which touches and deeply compromises our existence: the Lord who came into the world on the first Christmas and who will return glorious at the end of time, wants to come to our hearts now and our lives.

Just as the people of Israel prepared for the coming of the Messiah, which was expected as the fulfillment of God's promise to our first parents, renewed to the patriarchs and reiterated once and a thousand times by the word of the prophets, so also today the new people of God, the Christians, we prepare intensely to celebrate the updated memory of that great event, which meant the beginning of our salvation. Only if we have our hearts to welcome the Lord, as did Mary and Joseph, the shepherds and the magicians, will Advent and Christmas be a milestone of grace and salvation for us.

Throughout the four weeks of Advent, we will be invited to prepare ourselves to receive Jesus, to pave and clear the paths of our soul, that is, to conversion and inner change, to welcome with a clean heart the Lord who is born, which must be born or reborn with greater intensity in our lives. Also, throughout these four weeks, we will receive the call to put our lives at the feet of Christ, to renew our commitment to love him with all that we are and with all that we have.

Advent means arrival or coming; It also means meeting God with man. Our encounter with the Lord who comes again to us in this Advent will not be possible if we are not willing to listen to the voice of God and do his will. Nor will it be possible if it is not preceded by a warm encounter with our brothers, with attitudes of forgiveness, help,

detachment, service and love, because we cannot say that we welcome the Lord who comes back to us, if we do not renew our fraternity, if we do not welcome him in the brothers, especially in the poorest and neediest. Advent must be lived with intensity and hope, preparing our hearts to receive it and so that our encounter with Him transforms our lives and drives us to witness and announce it.

May the light of God illuminate your life with His power this season. Pastor Erika Martinez-Flores

LET YOUR LIGHT

Radio Ministry Summary

Thank you to everyone who completed the radio ministry survey. This summary will include comments we received verbally as well as those written on the surveys. 24 surveys were returned, all of which were dropped off at church;

none were submitted via mail or email. Almost all respondents "never" or "occasionally" listen to the radio broadcast. Generally, when people cannot attend church, they watch the worship service either on Facebook or YouTube.

The radio broadcast has been a special connection and worthwhile outreach for many people over the years. But issues with the radio station have had an impact. Consensus is that the radio ministry had a large listenership and was valuable years ago when the broadcast was on the FM station. Now that it is aired only on the AM station, which many people cannot receive, we have lost a lot of listeners. The required delayed broadcast is also a problem, defeating the importance of the announcements and prayer concerns.

Many voiced concerns that the radio ministry doesn't seem to be effective anymore, that what worked 20-30 years ago isn't relevant now. The request for sponsors has gone up significantly in the past year. There used to be a waiting list to sponsor a Sunday and now it seems there are one or two openings every month. With all the changes in technology, some members suggested that this ministry should evolve also, focusing more on other forms of media to reach younger families and people in community. Moving forward. After reviewing all the pros and cons, the written and verbal comments received, and after much discussion, the ALT voted in November to end the radio ministry program as of December 31, 2024. In its place, we will focus our outreach on other forms of media. Sponsorship opportunities will be available (as they were with radio ministry), and all sponsorship contributions will go into a designated "Media" account. Funds in this account will help pay for our music licensing, replacing the iPad or laptop when necessary, and other expenses relevant to our media outreach program.

AVOID THE SEASONAL CRUD



Respiratory illness season is fast approaching. Vaccines can help protect from serious bouts of flu, RSV (Respiratory Syncytial Virus), COVID-19, and pneumococcal pneumonia. Vaccines are available at pharmacies, doctor's office and health depts. The cost is covered by Medicare and most commercial insurances. Cost assistance may be available through the county health department. Also be aware of shingles and pertussis (whooping cough).

Daily ways to help prevent contamination to others and stay well are wash hands often, avoid touching eyes, nose, or mouth, get plenty of rest, do the elbow cough, and stay home if you don't feel well.

Please respect others' personal space regarding handshakes and hugs. Fist bumps and elbow touches are good alternatives.

Cardiovascular disease is the leading cause of noncommunicable disease deaths. Some common noncommunicable cardiovascular conditions and diseases include: heart attack, stroke, peripheral artery disease (PAD), and pulmonary embolism. Listen to your body and seek medical help! **Stay well**!
