Pastor Greetings,

See, I am doing a new thing!

Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?

I am making a way in the wilderness

and streams in the wasteland.

Isaiah 43.19

What's new? Well, obviously year-end comes to mind when another new year begins. But is there anything really new about it? After all, how many "new years" have we seen come and go in each of our lives?

"Behold, I make all things new," we hear God say in Revelation 21:5. All things. That would include each of us, as well as our church. Keep in mind that in making all things new, God is not saying that everything that is no longer exists, but that everything is made new in some way—it is given a facelift, it is given new purpose and meaning, it is given new enthusiasm and energy.

So, what's new about you? What is God doing new in your life? What do you see God doing new in the church? What is filling you anew with hope? What new thought is giving you new energy? What new thing is God doing that excites you? If you have an answer, let's talk about it and follow it and see what God is doing. If you don't have an answer, keep looking. God's promise is at work to make all things new.

One new thing will be your "Star Gift Word" for the year. On the day of Epiphany, first Sunday of the year, your "Star Gift Word" will be distributed at worship. You will remember that a Star Gift Word is nothing more than a star shape cut out of a piece of paper with a word written on it. The word is the gift — an invitation to reflect on the word and its relationship and meaning in your life. It may be a word you need in your life (time, hope, etc.) or it may be a word you have in your life that you need to get rid of (bitterness, envy, etc.) or it may be a word that leaves you wondering why you were given that particular word to reflect on. Whatever your word is, it will be a gift to you if you meditate on it, pray about it, think about it, etc.

Finally, I would like you to remember the words of John in the book of Revelation: "Behold, I make all things new." By keeping them in your mind and

heart, you will remember that whatever the coming year offers you personally, or for your family, or even for our church, you will be able to face it knowing that with God on our side, a bright new beginning will always be possible. A very happy and blessed New Year! Pastor Erika Martinez-Flores

The twinkling lights on the Christmas tree reminds me of the angels announcing Christ's birth to the shepherds. We are reminded to shine bright in everyday life.


