#### Pastor Greetings,

He has shown you, O mortal, what is good. And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God. Micah 6.8

#### "To Love Mercy"

In Jesus, God has committed himself completely to restoring hope to the poor, to those who were deprived of dignity, to foreigners, the sick, prisoners, and to the sinners whom he welcomed with kindness.

As a church, we are always called to know the Lord Jesus better, and to live our faith in a way that is consistent with a lifestyle that expresses the mercy of the Father. It is a commitment that we are called to assume in order to offer to all those we meet the concrete sign of God's closeness.

God has also committed himself to us. His first commitment was to create the world, and despite our attempts to destroy it, he is committed to keeping it alive. But his greatest commitment was to send his beloved Son. And with this, God has committed himself completely to restoring hope to the poor, to those who were deprived of dignity, to foreigners, the sick, prisoners, and to the sinners whom he welcomed with kindness. In all this, Jesus is a living expression of the Father's mercy.

He comes close to us to give us comfort, mercy, and forgiveness. This is God's commitment, and this is why he sent Jesus: to bring us close to us, to all of us, and to open the door of his love, of his heart, of his mercy. And this is very beautiful. Very beautiful! Starting from the merciful love with which Jesus expressed God's commitment, we too can and must respond to his love with our commitment. And this above all in situations of greatest need, where there is greater thirst for hope.

Practicing mercy is a true opportunity to enter deeply into the mystery of God's goodness and love. Our life, attitude and way of going through life must be a concrete sign that God is close to us. Small gestures of love, tenderness, care, which make us think that the Lord is with us, is close to us. Thus, the door of mercy is opened. Extending God's mercy is a testimony of our faith in Christ. We must always bring God's caress – because God has caressed us with his mercy – to others, to those who are in need, to those who have suffering in their hearts or are sad: to approach them with God's caress, which is the same one that He has given to us. May these times of despair and uncertainty be our opportunity to let God act through us and extend our hands to show mercy.
